### President's message




It was great to see you all at our first meeting of 2014, there was a great atmosphere around the room with everyone catching up with friends, sharing their stories of the festive period.

### Sri Lanka Water Project

A few years ago while looking for an international project, Rotarian Brian Johnson, a member of St Margaret's Parish church in Glenrothes became interested in the joint ministry with his church and a church in Sri Lanka. Saman Perera, a minister from Sri Lanka visited Glenrothes and told of some of the poor villages in Sri Lanka where the water quality was very poor and there was no clean water in many households. As we also had Rotarians Rube Fernando from Sri Lanka and Arlene Kidd who works with Rube and visits Sri Lanka on a regular basis, this seemed like an excellent International project for the Rotary Club of Glenrothes as we could get first hand reports on how funds were being spent and on progress of the project. Both Arlene and Rube met up with Saman Perera in Sri Lanka to discuss the project and Rube then involved his brother who is responsible for the infra structure in Sri Lanka to verify the poor water quality report in the North Central District. In the first instance, filters are being sourced to filter the existing water supply to allow households to access clean water. Arlene has now visited what is the last village in this

situation with poor water quality and sent this report to Brian last week.

#### **Arlene in Sri Lanka**

I made the long journey yesterday to the village and met with the families. We have a list of the neediest households of which there are around 60+. I am researching the available filters and prices this week. This is the only village remaining without direct fresh water. I am back in office on Monday 20th but will leave again on



21st for Germany and return around 31st. My schedule then takes me to India on 1st Feb so will not be around til April. Arlene also sent the 2 photographs below of the village she visited. There is £3000 in the International pot for this project

## International Golfing Fellowship By Rotarian Krishna

I have been a member of IGFR since 1993 after attending RI Convention in Melbourne and had the pleasure of taking part in both International and European golfing events in four Continents. This year International event is in Italy about 300 hundred Rotarians are taking part with their Golfing and non-golfing partners.

In 1963 Gavin Reekie, as Governor Nominee for District 101 attended the World Assembly at Lake Placid in New York State and at the final banquet was seated along with his wife Connie, and then in coming World President


Carl Miller. Carl's theme for the year ahead was 'Meeting Rotary's Challenge in the Space Age' and promoted the idea of Matched Districts.

Gavin related the wonderful golfing liaison between District 101 & 728 and the Jackson Christy Porridge Bowl Trophy [which I won it 1994 just a trivial information] and suggested to further the World theme of Matched Districts that Carl should develop this Golfing fellowship on a WORLD basis. Carl responded,' Gavin, I want you good people in Scotland to organise a similar competition between Districts on a world basis and I will provide you with a suitable trophy. I will be in Scotland in two months time, Let me have your ideas. Then two months later a meeting took place at Gleneagles Hotel, Scotland on 17th August 1963. Carl was then the World President of RI and Gavin was District Governor of District 101, based on Carl Miller's theme after much discussion the well known jewellers, A & C Cairncross, Perth, Scotland produced a suitable design at a cost of £256 paid by Carl Miller, and continues today as the most coveted of the IGFR trophies both for intrinsic value as well as its meaning to fellow golfing Rotarians. Gavin Reekie presented the "Runner-up" trophy and it was Gavin who proposed me to IGFR. First World Tournament was held at St. Andrews in 1964. There are about 1200 fellow golfers representing 64 countries. There are over 20 national golf fellowship groups, the largest of which is the United States Group. 26th RIBI Club
