#### **Rotaract Speaker**

At our lunchtime meeting on October 22nd the speaker was Anastasiya a student of St Andrews Belvaeva University and President of the St Andrews Rotaract Club. She mediated the work on a range of community projects which included Rotaract's participation in the organisation of events for the elderly and infirm. Approved and supervised the course of international projects, such as supporting a school for abandoned children in India. She ensured the club's participation in sponsorship of youth development projects, such as World Affairs Seminar. Organised a leadership development/ interview skills workshop for students and mobilised fundraising events for various worldwide causes, including З End Polio Now. Anastasiya gave us a brief insight into her upbringing and life in the Crimea The Crimean Peninsula also known simply as Crimea is a major land mass on the northern coast of the Black Sea that is almost completely surrounded by water. The peninsula is located south of the Ukrainian region of Kherson and west of the Russian region of Kuban, surrounded by two seas. the Black Sea and the Sea of Azov to the northeast. She spoke of the beauty in Crimea and the wonderful architecture. the Castle called the swallows nest and the church and legend which is Foros resurrection church.
