Walk of peace

This year's theme Light up Rotary, proved to be the catalyst for the first ever Peace Walk in the town. It all started at a liaison meeting



in September with the Rectors of the 3 loacl High Schoolsnamely Auchmuty Glenrothes and Glenwood

--when we explained the Rotary theme for the year and suggested some kind of organised walk carrying lights, perhaps in the town park. An animated discussion ensued as a result of which it was decided to do a walk promoting peace on the Thursday evening before Armistice Sunday starting from the 3 schools and gathering the. town war memorial approximately 20 minutes walk from each. Alan Pithie, Rector at Auchmuty, applied for a licence to hold the event and completed a risk assessment for the schools. Letters were sent to parents who were also invited to attend and of the local churches some offered support as well. At 6 pm each school held a special assembly consisting of song, poetry and

video appropriate to the occasion and performed by pupils . The processions armed with torches, lanterns, glow sticks and the like then set off to the war memorial. We. certainly did liaht Glenrothes with many residents at windows to see what was going on! Once there Rev. Alan Kimmit from the nearby St. Columba's church welcomed everybody and Club President Chris Grist explained the Rotary theme after which pupils from the 3 schools performed some of the items from their assembly programme. We purchased 4 white wreaths from the British Legion and these were now laid by President Chris and the Head Boy and Head Girl of each school to the strains of Highland Cathedral played by a piper from Auchmuty. The closing remarks were made by MP Lindsay Roy before we all joined in singing Give Peace A Chance -a very moving end to a remarkable evening.
