The NC500 stands for the North Coast 500. It is a 500mile round road trip starting at Inverness, going north to John O'Groats then west to Durness, south to Scourie, Ullapool, Gairloch, Torridon, Applecross then back to Inverness via Garve.

Kay and I were part of a group of 45 Harley Davidson enthusiasts riding 32 Harleys making the trip starting on Thursday 28th April. You may recall that this was the day when it was snowing in Glenrothes at lunchtime, so I was rather anxious about what we might encounter on the A9. Anyway we set off and drove through quite a bit of snow before leaving the worst of the bad weather behind after Aviemore. It was lots of fun with many interesting stops on the way such as Dunrobin castle, John O'Groats, Smoo Cave, and special fun getting into and out of Applecross which has a wonderful set of tight hairpin bends as the road drops 2000ft.

Cowdenbeath Ladies Day


