

Ian Chalmers (Founder Member)

It was with deep sadness we heard over the Christmas break of the death of Founder member Ian Chalmers. Ian had attended our Christmas lunch on 21st December and was in good spirits. He had been attending our weekly meetings every week and never missed a week. Ian had fallen in his house on Xmas day and was taken to Victoria Hospital for assessment, but due to the time of year it was a very slow process. It took hours to make sure he was eating and ok. On Wednesday afternoon 27th December he took a turn and after X-rays it was discovered he had fluid on his lungs. He was put on 24-48 hr anti



biotics, morphine and sedative. By this time it was too late, but fortunately quick. He passed away peacefully on Thursday at 2 pm. Ian was a founder member of the club in 1957 and was the 4th President of the club in 1960-61. Ian was a local Dentist having practised in Kennoway before moving to Glenrothes. The club celebrated its 60th year on the 28th April this year with a meal in the Balbirnie Golf Club where Ian was tasked to cut the 60th Anniversary cake. At our first meeting of the New year Rotarians paid tribute to Ian and Rotarian Hamish recalled memories over the years of his good friend. We were delighted to welcome Two of Ians daughters to the meeting. **He will be sadly missed by us all.**


