RENEE MACRAE An illustrated Lecture

Her Disappearance and Murder on 12th November 1976

(Britain's longest Missing Person case.)

Around midnight on the above date, and in atrocious weather, a passing bus driver reported seeing a car burning fiercely in lay-by 162 just 14 miles south of Inverness. The car had earlier contained Mrs Renee MacRae and her son, Andrew. Neither has been seen since in spite of extensive searches and theories, and all police work has come to nothing. Because of lack of progress in the case, in the Spring of 2006 Mr Archie Lawrie in conjunction with the world-class psychic medium, Frances, began a concerted effort to see what information could be gained by using on-site psychical methods.
