Young Chef Competition



He fatigues easily and can only propel himself for a short time and before tiring having to stop. That could all change with the addition of a Smartdrive MX2 to Luuk's wheelchair. This little. but verv expensive, piece of equipment simply clips onto the rear of his chair and turns it into а powered



wheelchair, which Luuk will be able to operate himself. Lukes mum said "This will allow us to get out and about even when Dad is working. Ultimately though, it will bring a new level of independence to Luke. Unfortunately it costs £4900
